## LAMBPLAN LINK

Lambplan data is now available through the DSSA website and "ABRI Animal Search" facility.

Click on the ABRI Animal Search link and type in the stud ID or prefix, whichever you prefer and then select the sheep that you want details of.

Information similar to that appearing below is provided and if the breeder has Lambplan data for that sheep the word [Lambplan](#) (as shown below) appears below the Lambplan ID number and is a link that allows access to the data.

The use of technical tools such as Lambplan are an important component of flock management in particular when selecting animals for breeding stock.

Other leading breeds of sheep have a high participation rate in Lambplan and the resultant data available to assist with stock selection through the use of Australian Sheep Breeding Values (ASBVs) produces a high level of accuracy and understanding of the system.

Breeders are able to select for specific traits that they require within their flocks and use ASBVs as a vital component of their decision making process.
